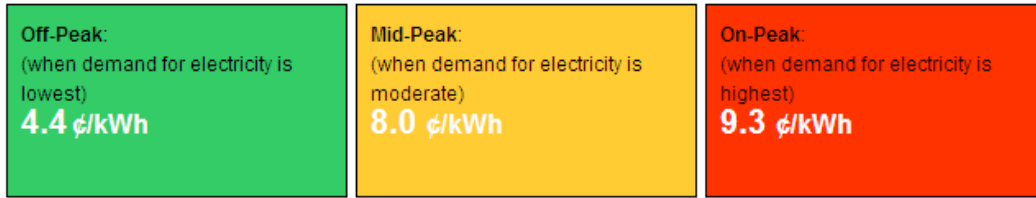


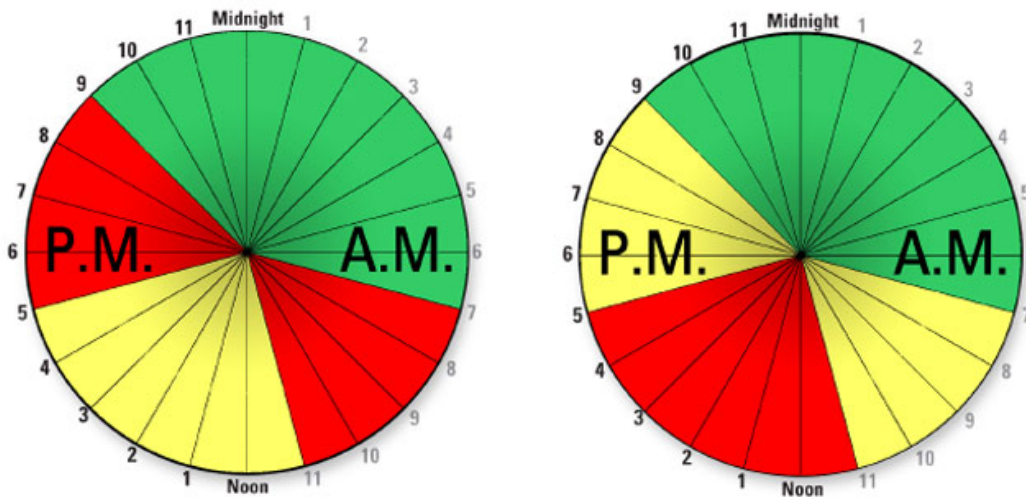
Time of Use Pricing for the Province of Ontario As of November 2009

This pricing system is not in effect in Thunder Bay.
We anticipate that it will be implemented in the spring of 2011.



Winter (Nov 1-Apr 30) - Weekdays

Summer (May 1-Oct 31) - Weekdays



Weekends and Holidays will be priced at the "Off Peak" pricing.

Current Regulated Price Plan Pricing

Residential consumers who purchase electricity from their local utility are charged the following rates for electricity consumption. These rates are set by the Ontario Energy Board as part of the Regulated Price Plan. If you purchase electricity from an electricity retailer, the prices you pay will be different and will be stated in the contract you signed.

Season	Your consumption	Price per kWh
SUMMER May 1 – Oct 31	First 600 kWh	5.8 ¢
	Consumption above 600 kWh	6.7 ¢
WINTER Nov 1 – April 30	First 1000 kWh	5.8 ¢
	Consumption above 1000 kWh	6.7 ¢

The threshold that defines higher and lower electricity prices for residential Regulated Price Plan consumers is set at 600 kilowatt hours per month during the summer (May 1st to October 31st) and 1,000 kilowatt hours per month during the winter (November 1st to April 30th). This difference recognizes that consumers use more electricity for lighting and indoor activity in the winter and that some Ontarians are reliant on electricity for their heating source.

The consumption threshold for non-residential RPP (small business) consumers remains at 750 kilowatt hours per month for all seasons.
