### **Thunder Bay Hydro Awards Electrical Safety and Energy Conservation Contest Winners**

Thunder Bay, ON – This year, approximately 1,000 students from Grades three to six from 11 schools received electrical safety and energy conservation awareness lessons directly from Thunder Bay Hydro staff this year in their Annual *Hi-Line Hazards Electrical Safety & Energy Conservation Awareness Program*. The presentation offers a multimedia presentation to students in Grades three to six and utilizes a Hazard Hamlet Board, video, and PowerPoint presentation. Staff from various departments at Thunder Bay Hydro (including Power Line, Energy & Conservation, Customer Service, and Locates) took part in the delivery of the presentations. In a contest that followed, six of them were found to have great skill in expressing what they learned in their drawing.
